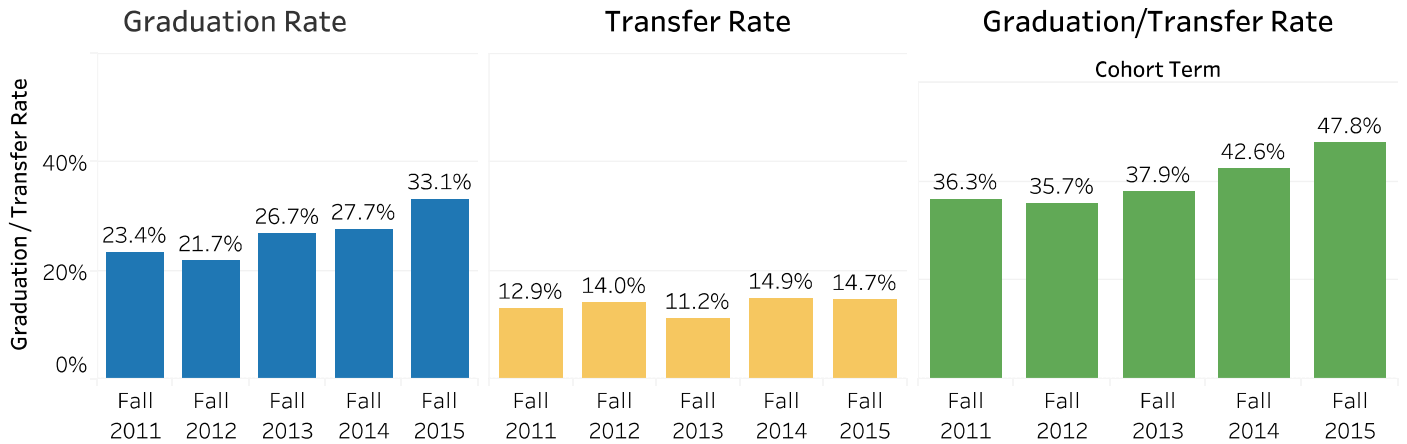

“Cohort” includes only first-time, full-time students entering during the fall term who are seeking an associate degree or a certificate of 12 months or longer. For community colleges, this federal cohort definition provides a LIMITED representation. The success of less than half of Virginia Western’s incoming students is shown in these figures.
