ARTICULATION AGREEMENT BETWEEN RADFORD UNIVERISTY, INTERDISCIPLINARY STUDIES/ELEMENTARY EDUCATION BACHELOR OF SCIENCE PROGRAM AND

VIRGINIA WESTERN COMMUNITY COLLEGE, SOCIAL SCIENCES OR GENERAL STUDIES ASSOCIATE'S DEGREE

WHEREAS, Virginia Western Community College and Radford University exist to provide educational services and opportunities; and

WHEREAS, Virginia Western Community College and Radford University cooperate effectively to ensure that citizens of the Commonwealth receive the highest quality educational experiences and opportunities; and

WHEREAS, Virginia Western Community College and Radford University desire to reduce transfer barriers between the two institutions; now and

WHEREAS, Virginia Western Community College and Radford University make the following articulation agreement:

GENERAL PROVISIONS

- 1. Admission to the Radford University Bachelor of Science (BS) degree in Interdisciplinary Studies program will be open to any student who has completed the Associate in Science (AS) degree in Social Science Education Track as outlined in the section titled "Program of Study."
- 2. All courses taken at accredited institutions other than Radford University will transfer to this program only if passed with a grade of "C" or better.
- 3. No fewer than 45 semester hours must be taken at Radford University; at least 50 percent of the Interdisciplinary Studies major (as defined by the School of Teacher Education and Leadership) must be Radford University courses. The total program consists of a minimum of 121 semester hours; 30 of the last 39 semester hours of the degree must be completed through Radford University. To graduate with honors from Radford University, a student must complete 60 semester hours at Radford University. If a student has completed 59 or fewer hours at RU and has established a grade point average of 3.5 or higher, that student can graduate "with distinction."
- 4. The program requirements may be modified to conform to any changes in academic programs at Radford University or the Interdisciplinary Studies program degree requirements. Any such revisions will be communicated to currently enrolled students and the Academic Dean of Virginia Western Community College by April 1 preceding the academic year in which the new requirements would take effect. Radford University reserves the right to change, when warranted, any of the provisions of this agreement, course offerings, assigned teaching faculty, calendars, class locations, and fees as might be required. All teacher education programs are subject to change based on regional, state, and federal approval and accreditation guidelines.

PROGRAM OF STUDY

- 1. Core curriculum requirements at Virginia Western Community College (40 semester hours)
- 2. Interdisciplinary Core requirements at Virginia Western Community College (10 semester hours)
- 3. Social Science concentration requirement at Virginia Western Community College (12 semester hours). Students will need a minimum of 6 semester hours above the Associate's degree to satisfy the Social Science concentration requirements; these requirements are to be completed at Virginia Western Community College prior to beginning the Radford University program. This requirement may vary based on specific courses completed by individual students. Other concentrations will be considered in lieu of

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the social science concentration based on individual student's academic course work; the decision to accept an alternative concentration will be made by the Director of Academic Advising in consultation with the RU Roanoke Coordinator and the Assistant Dean/Director of Field Experience.

- 4. Interdisciplinary Core requirements through Radford University (9 semester hours)
- 5. Special Education concentration requirements through Radford University (12 semester hours)
- Professional Education requirements through Radford University (39 semester hours which includes 27 hours of field work/internship). Note: The 1 credit hour, EDU 100 course at Virginia Western Community College does not transfer to Radford University but it is used to satisfy the 50-hour observation/experience requirement.
- 7. Additional hours required for the associate's degree (most of which will transfer to RU) will round out the program (11 semester hours).

All students pursuing this program must meet the following requirements:

- 1. A 3.0 grade point average at RU;
- 2. A 3.0 grade point average in the major;
- 3. A 3.0 grade point average in professional education coursework;
- 4. Must have a grade of C or higher on all RU coursework
- 5. No record of criminal violations or violations of RU codes and policies;
- 6. Passing scores on the Core Academic Skills for Educators: Mathematics assessment, PRAXIS II: Elementary Education Multiple Subjects assessment, and the Virginia Communication and Literacy Assessment (VCLA) for formal admission to the RU Teacher Education program. A passing score on the Reading for Virginia Educators: Elementary and Special Education assessment (RVE) is required for licensure.
- 7. All of the requirements above must be maintained in order to be eligible for graduation.

All students will complete a formal review process for admission to the Radford University Teacher Education Program.

It is important to note that this agreement is not exclusively intended for students who matriculate through the A.S., Social Science degree program at Virginia Western Community College. Any student who has completed the required coursework may also be accepted to this program. RU courses will be offered at the Higher Education Center in downtown Roanoke or at the Thomas Center on the Virginia Western Community College campus. In special cases, courses may be offered at other locations on the Virginia Western Community College campus.

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Virginia Western Community College Academic Requirements

The following table shows the Radford University transfer course equivalency for each required course in the VWCC A.S., Social Sciences (with Education Specialization), degree program. It is important to note that 47 of the 60 credit hours required for the Associates degree can be applied to the Interdisciplinary Studies degree. Students will have to complete an additional 15 credit hours beyond the A.S. degree to be eligible for the IDS degree program with elementary licensure. Thus, students will complete a total of 62 hours of coursework at Virginia Western prior to matriculating to the RU program.
